

# Return to Work Criteria as of 9/29/2021

## For Someone with COVID-19-Like Symptoms of Illness Must Meet ALL Criteria Below

- Proof of a Negative COVID-19 **PCR** Test
- Symptoms have Improved
- At least 24 hours have passed since no fever without the use of fever-reducing medication

## For Someone Who Tests Positive for COVID-19 and Has Symptoms Must Meet ALL Criteria Below

- 10 calendar days (return on 11th day) has passed since date of **initial** positive test **AND**
- Symptoms have Improved **AND**
- At least 24 hours have passed with no fever without the use of fever-reducing medication

## For Someone Who Tests Positive for COVID-19 and Has No Symptoms (Asymptomatic)

- 10 calendar days have passed since the date of the **initial** positive test result

## For Someone Who Is a Close Contact of a Confirmed COVID-19 Case and is **Not Vaccinated**

- Return to work after 7 calendar days (8<sup>th</sup> day from last day of exposure) after receiving a negative **PCR** test (test must occur on day 5 or later) **OR**
- Return to work after 10 calendar days (11<sup>th</sup> day from last day of exposure) without testing if asymptomatic

## For Someone Who is a Close Contact of a Confirmed COVID-19 Case and is Fully Vaccinated Staff Are Not Required to Quarantine

### Must Meet ALL Criteria Below

- Are fully vaccinated (i.e.,  $\geq 2$  weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series, or  $\geq 2$  weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine)
- Have remained asymptomatic since their current COVID-19 exposure
- **Strongly recommended to** test between day 3 and 5 after exposure, even if you do not have symptoms
- Monitor for COVID-19 symptoms for 14 days, should any symptoms develop, you should immediately self-isolate and be tested
